Memorial Grant Program

About the Program

The Officer Down Memorial Page, Inc. (ODMP), Memorial Grant Program is designed to assist law enforcement agencies with limited funding to create a lasting memorial to their officers who have been killed in the line of duty.

The ODMP will provide funding up to \$100 per fallen officer to be memorialized with a maximum grant of \$600 per memorial. Joint memorials involving more than one agency are limited to the \$600 maximum.

Who Can Apply

Applications will be considered for any law enforcement agency in the United States that meet the following requirements:

- One or more fallen officers currently honored on the ODMP †**
- One or more of the officers must have been killed more than 15 years ago**
- All of the agency's fallen officers must be included on the memorial**

Program Objectives

In order to serve as a lasting tribute to the agency's fallen officers, we encourage each agency submitting a grant application to design a memorial with significance to both the agency and the community it serves. With that in mind, the memorial must:

- Be **accessible** to the public
- Contain the **names and end of watch** for each of the fallen officers

Although the grant program is primarily focused on the creation of new memorials, applications will also be considered for agencies wishing to replace, refurbish, or restore an existing memorial.

Application Deadlines

The ODMP will consider applications four times per year, during the first week of each of the following months: January, April, July, and October. Grant applications must be postmarked by the first day of the month of each deadline period to be considered. Grant funds for approved memorials will be made available within one month of the approval date.

Requirements

A complete application must be submitted. Agencies awarded funds must submit a photograph of the completed memorial to the ODMP upon completion. All applications will be reviewed by the ODMP's Board of Directors, who will serve as ODMP Memorial Grant Program Review Board. The Board may modify the guidelines on a per-application basis under extenuating circumstances.

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3. Attach the following items to the application

If any of these items are not available include a brief description as to why. Otherwise the application will be considered incomplete.

Agency's shoulder patch. The agency's shoulder patch will be used on the ODMP Memorial Grant Program website to promote the agency's memorial.

Visual representation of memorial. Include a visual representation of the proposed memorial (i.e., photograph, sketch, diagram, etc.).

Price estimate. Include a copy of a price estimate or invoice that includes the estimated total cost of the memorial.

Historical research. To ensure the agency has embraced the meaning behind the memorial, evidence of research into each officer's death must be attached (i.e., newspaper articles).

4. Signature Required

I attest that the contents of this grant application are true and accurate. I agree that if a grant is awarded to my agency, the agency's shoulder patch and memorial design documents may be published on the ODMP website, other ODMP publications, and in news releases. I agree that if the memorial is not built, the entire amount of the grant will be returned to the ODMP Memorial Grant Program.
